1. **Call to Order** – Meeting called to Order by Dave Peterson, Nottawa Twp. Supervisor, at 6:08 pm
2. **Pledge of Allegiance**
3. **Roll Call of Attendees** – David Peterson, Steve Wolf, Jeff Wenzel (abs), Dennis Allen (abs) Patricia Boomer, Jack Rote, Shirley Betts also attended tonight’s meeting,  
Special Guest: Paul Hausler, Water Resources Practice Leader, Progressive AE.
4. **Rules of Meeting** – **Please turn off cell phones or take calls outside of the meeting room. Comments limited to 3 minutes.**
5. **Approval of today’s meeting agenda and the minutes from the June 2nd, 2022, LTIB meeting** – The draft minutes from June 2<sup>nd</sup>, meetings and the agenda items for tonight’s meeting were approved on a motion from Steve Wolf, supported by Dave Peterson and all other Board Members.
6. **Treasurer’s Report** – Dave Peterson reported the County Treasurer Office LTIB Cash Balance as of 7/14/2022 is \$494,861. 2022 Revenue collected was \$331,955, the remaining balance is carry-forward balances from prior years.
7. **Payment of Bills** – 6 bills, totaling \$72,436.65 were presented for payment. Clarke Aquatics (3 bills) \$19,648.65 for weed control treatment and Permit application fees; Progressive AE \$3,000.00 for plant control, Spicer Group \$1,500.00 for EGLE coordination on permit application review; Easy Pro \$49,120.00 for 2 BIO/Augmentation applications. A motion to approve by Steve Wolf, supported by Patricia Boomer and all other Board members.
8. **Lake Templene Advisory Group Report** – Jack Rote presented the report from the LTIB Advisory Committee.
  - a. **BIO/Augmentation/Aeration:** 1. The second bio-augmentation treatment was completed on June 29<sup>th</sup>, 2022. The dispensing hoses were weighted to get treatment deeper into water.
  - b. **Aquatic Plant Management:** 1. Because of no drawdown for past 2 years, a more aggressive aquatic plant management treatments are needed this season. 2. The review of lake weeds on 7/14 identified some starry stonewort and celery but overall the weeds look ok. The 2nd 2022 aquatic survey completed by Progressive AE, found 36 acres required treatment. 3. The additional information requested by EGLE for the Drawdown application was provided by the Spicer Group on June 3<sup>rd</sup>, no additional information has been requested in the past 30 days.
  - c. **Fishery Enhancement:** 1. The fish population survey was awarded to Freshwater Physicians, Inc. will be conducted July 14<sup>th</sup> – 16<sup>th</sup>. 2. Redear Sunfish are not available from Michigan hatcheries, but

Stoney Creek Fish Farm is working to get them from southern states this fall, Patricia Boomer to follow-up with them on status.

- d. The Conservation District has been conducting the water sampling studies this summer, members of the Advisory Committee will participate to become trained on the process.
- e. There were 2 responses to the bathymetric RFQ, Spicer Group and Clarke Aquatics. The Advisory Board will meet with both to review their submission and plan to have a recommendation by the next board meeting.

**9. SAD**

- a. The Resolution to Proceed with Improvements to Lake Templene will cover a 10-year period, 2023 – 2032
- b. A 2023 budget of \$334,500 to address Aquatic plant control, Bottomland reduction, and Fisheries enhancement was developed. This would require annual assessments of \$860/\$430 (Developed/undeveloped lots). Will have ability to modify the budget and assessment amounts as needed.
- c. Timing for mailing and postings were finalized.
